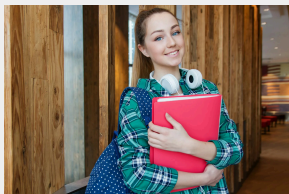

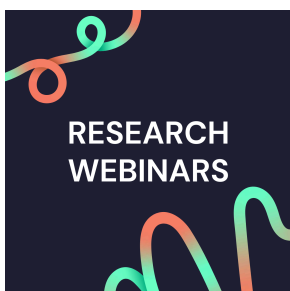


Young researchers marathon, Badajoz, April 24th 2025

This multidisciplinary Congress is open to students below 35 years from the whole alliance. Submit your paper before Feb, 14th.

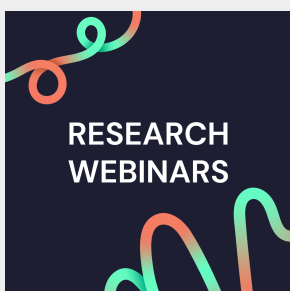

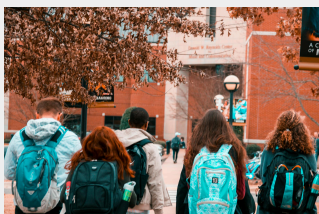
